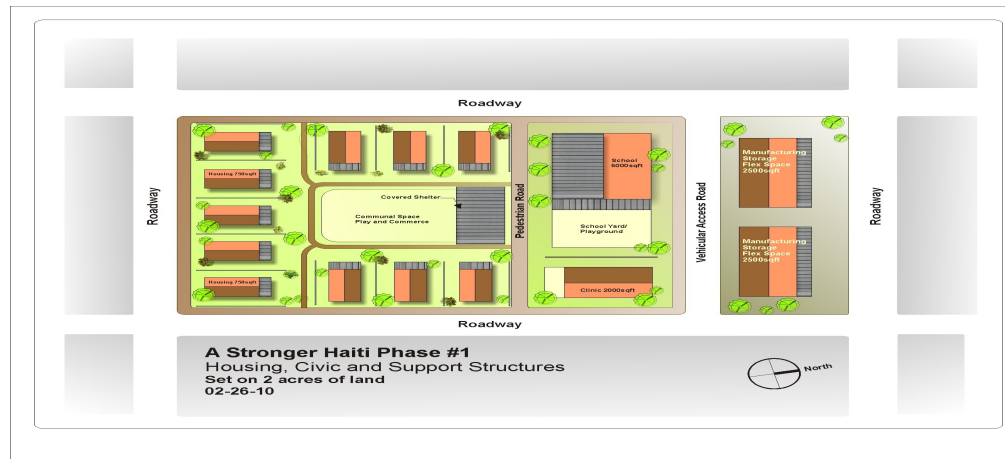


“From Healthcare to Homes”

A \$1,000,000 Fundraising Initiative Aid for Haiti



Immediate aid is still needed and is crucial for Haiti. Months after the devastating earthquake, many who were injured still seek medical attention; others are still without food, water, clothes and shelter. In an effort to streamline our aid initiatives, we are constantly identifying urgent issues while finding ways to provide speedy and efficient assistance directly to the people of Haiti.

***A Stronger Haiti* is raising \$1,000,000 in support of these efforts. The majority of the money, which we expect to raise from donations and fundraisers, will go towards the emergency and long-term relief efforts. With the assistance of a leading global building systems company, we will create “on the ground” logistical support via the construction of four housing units, a bathing and toilet facility, and one storage unit that will allow volunteer doctors and other qualified aid professionals to administer patient care.**

These units are *Hurricane* and *Earthquake* resistant and feature many favorable attributes of conservation and efficiency. These four-walled structures come pre-engineered and include chases to receive plumbing and electrical systems and can be assembled within a week (with the assumption that the slab

foundation and other roughing have been prepared). This initiative is especially important with the imminent rain and hurricane season in Haiti. The housing units will consist of a dormitory to house 12 volunteers; an office to conduct aid business and to map out relief logistics; a surgical unit with two operating rooms, and a general care unit with two rooms for post-op patient care.

We will begin with one location, costing approximately \$200,000 and subsequently build other facilities in the region. This initiative seeks to provide care and support to the Haitian people by supplying them with much needed healthcare today and a foundation for future development tomorrow. At first, these facilities will be used as medical support units but as the situation improves we will then be able to re-purpose the structures into functioning housing, clinics, schools and work facilities.

Further, we will seek local manufacturing that was affected by the devastation and provide them with these facilities which can be re-purposed according to their needs. This will enable them to get back up and running, thereby creating jobs for the local community. We will use the same model for schools, clinics and small businesses all surrounding the communities that we, with your help, will rebuild. We want to provide tangible hope to a people in crisis, and that is why we are asking for your support.
